We love sailing at Lake Townsend.

The sailing characteristics are unlike any other venue we sail at. Sailing at Lake Townsend, I've learned how to read the wind, gotten a better understanding of shore effects, and developed a great appreciation of my boat which, I think, was designed with Lake Townsend in mind.

Saturday morning, Eric and I arrived at the lake, and there was a light breeze on the water. This was going to be a great day to try out my new main sail that I, Howard, and Eric had spent 32.5 hours in May & June assembling, sewing, measuring, and admiring. Well the first time I tried to raise the sail, the Howard Loop kept going lopsided on me, so I couldn't attach it to the Howard Hook. The second time, I focused on watching the loop go up the mast. I raised the sail about 1/2 up the mast, and could raise it no further. Perplexed, I lowered it and tried again. Only then did I notice that the

battens were behind and caught in the shrouds, broken even. Well, I should have known better, and at least we had wind, and as it turned out spare battens. Even after swapping out the batten, I had to be careful to get the boom attached quickly so that the wind did not blow the mainsail backwards across the shrouds and break yet more battens.

That may have been the strongest winds of the day. In the first race, Eric and I started on Port while the monohulls started on Starboard. I was a few seconds early to the pin and sail the line. A last minute wind shift made the start starboard favored, and I had to tack to starboard, forcing Eric to also take to starboard. Turns out I was to leeward of a monohull and Eric had tacked into clear air. After pulling away from the monohulls, I tacked back to port towards the middle of the lake. I was sure I would have Eric on the first weather leg and he was near shore in what looked like no wind, and I was in the middle of the lake

with a bit of wind. Turns out that the winds next to shore were so shifty, the each time the shift occurred, Eric simply tacked the main and jib and kept going towards the weather mark. Eric was on a layline to the weather mark, first to round, and able to sail the rumline to the leeward mark where Race Committee shortened course. I was out in the middle of the lack, getting headed, and had to sail a much greater distance to the weather mark. I was last to round the weather mark.

The second race, the winds were slightly better, and I was the only one at the line at the gun on starboard tack. Eric was buried amongst the monohulls. I kept my lead round the weather mark. Eric focused catching me going down wind. I headed up to keep Eric from rolling me, then returned back down to my proper course. I managed to stay in front of him for several minutes, but finally, Eric established overlap to my leeward from clear astern. At this point, Eric was in control and we sailed thus to the starboard layline to the leeward mark. I tried to increase the distance between us by heading up so that I could tack and get away from Eric, but still, Eric was too close. When Eric tacked at the starboard layline to the mark, Eric was in the lead, clear ahead. Eric approached the leeward mark, hailed no room. and rounded the leeward mark wide, slow, and tight coming up. I rounded wide, fast, but behind Eric coming out of the rounding. Eric continue to lengthen the distance between us to finish first in the second race. It was a good race, and I'm sure my new mainsail had something to do with it.

Sunday morning, we arrived at the lake to very flat glassy water. Bernie, our Principal Race Officer, postponed on shore for about an hour, during which time Eric and I fielded questions on shortening course, proper course, and starting tactics. After about an hour, three of the competitors started heading out, and Bernie decided it was now or never, and went out to see if

there was enough wind to race. It was very hot, and the winds were very light. I stayed on shore, broke down my boat, and waited. David Raper won both starts on Sunday, and finished first in the second race.

Special thanks to race committee for getting in four races. We had several guests on race committee, Eric, Melinda, Kate, and Scot; students from the sailing class who are very interested in getting out there and experiencing the Lake Townsend wind with a jib sheet in hand.
